	Retirement/IRA Charitable Transfer	• Exclude up to \$100,000 of gift from taxable income if 70 ¹ / ₂
	Personal Property	Potential tax deduction for fair market value
DEFERRED, IRREVOCABLE LIFE INCOME GIFTS	Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust	 Tax deduction for UND Foundation's remainder interest No initial capital gains tax
	Charitable Remainder Unitrust	 Tax deduction for UND Foundation's remainder interest No initial capital gains tax
	Charitable Gift Annuity	 Tax deduction for UND Foundation's remainder interest Often initially avoids capital gains tax Portion of income may be tax-free
OTHER IRREVOCABLE GIFTS	Retained Life Estate	 Retention of ownership rights in personal residence, vacation home, or farm Tax deduction for UND Foundation's remainder interest in property Avoids capital gains tax
	Charitable Lead Trust	 Trust principal reverts to donor or family members Allows for transfer of assets to family members at reduced tax cost
DEFERRED, REVOCABLE GIFTS	Bequest in Will	 Control over assets during lifetime Ability to establish legacy over lifetime Avoids estate tax
	Retirement Accounts	Estate and income tax deduction if UND Foundation is beneficiary
	Life Insurance	 Tax deduction for premiums paid on an existing policy Tax deduction for cash/replacement value of paid-up policy Avoids estate taxes
	Transfer on Death	 Control over assets during lifetime Ability to establish legacy over lifetime Avoids estate tax
